
Israeli HE System - Snapshot



- **❖ 310,000** students (50% of cohort) in **64 institutions**:
 - 9 Universities (Public)
 - 55 Colleges (42 Public; 13 Private)
- ❖ Shanghai ranking: 2 HEIs in Top100, 3 in Top500
- ❖ No. 7 in citations / paper (#1 in CS; #3 in Engineering)
- ❖ 12 Nobel prizes (6 chemistry; 2 economics); 3 Turing awards; 1 Fields medal



Governance of the Israeli Higher Education System





The Council for Higher Education (CHE)



Provides **accreditation** of new degrees & programs



Approves the **establishment of new institutions** and **Licensing** of branches of foreign HE Institutions



Conducts **Quality Assurance** of existing programs



Safeguards **academic freedom** while advancing academic research and teaching



The Planning and Budgeting Committee - PBC



Plans the development of the HE system at the national level, taking into account both academic and national needs



Negotiates with the Ministry of Finance the share of higher education in the state budget.



Allocates the budget to the HE institutions (HEI's)




Examines requests to open new institutions & new academic programs from the planning and budgetary points of view



Ensures that institutional budgets are balanced and executed according to plan while ensuring the HEI's solvency




The birth of the first academic institutions:






Massive Growth in Number of Colleges

Renewed Excellence

Up to the 1990's: Elitist system:

- Low % of students
- Universities only
- Adequate budgeting
- Impressive accomplishments

1990's -2009:Rapid Growth:

- No. of Students
- No. & diversity of Institutions
- Budget freeze/cuts:
- Shrinking, aging faculty
- Brain Drain
- Deterioration of infrastructures

2010-2016: Repositioning HE in Israel

- Six-year plan & +30% budget increase
- Focused on academic excellence + improving access for specific populations


