



International cooperation

EU Member States + Third countries associated to the Programme:

Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Republic of North Macedonia, Republic of Serbia, Republic of Turkey +-

Third countries not associated to the Programme: All other countries throughout the world



What is an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master?

A high-level integrated & transnational study programme at MA level

A Master programme of excellence open to all disciplines

Delivered by an international consortium of HEIs from different countries worldwide & other partners


Offering high-level scholarships to excellent students worldwide



EMJM – main objectives

- Support quality, innovation, excellence, internationalisation of HEIs through academic cooperation within the EHEA and beyond
- ✓ Increase quality and attractiveness of the EHEA
- ✓ Support EU External Action in higher education
- ✓ Increase synergies between HE, innovation and research
- ✓ Improve competences, skills, employability of Master graduates
- ✓ Respond to societal and labour market needs





- At application stage EMJM proposals must present fully developed joint study programmes, ready to run and to be advertised worldwide after their selection.



How does an EMJM look like?

Fixed Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master

Commitment to enrol a certain number of students per project

At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90, 120 ECTS)


Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection

At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme)

Geographical balance of students: no more than 10% of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality



Taking part as an Organisation





- Open to any public or private organisation worldwide
- Applications can be submitted by any eligible HEI worldwide
- ✓ HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: valid ECHE
- ✓ HEIs in third countries not associated to the Programme: should commit to ECHE principles in the Partnership Agreement
- ✓ HEIs from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme: completed accreditation/evaluation of the master programme





Attractive simplified EU funding scheme Selection of the most talented students worldwide





Taking part as an individual

- Open to students worldwide
- Applicants:
 - ✓ must hold a first higher education degree or equivalent
 - ✓ must not have benefited previously from an EMJM scholarship
- The best ones can benefit from a scholarship depending on the number of scholarships available (Up to max. 1.400 € per month)



EMJM Award criteria and Evaluation procedure

EMJM Award Criteria:

- Relevance (max. 30 points)
- Quality of the project design and implementation (max. 30 points)
- Quality of the partnership and the cooperation arrangements (max. 20 points)
- Impact (max. 20 points)

 Peer review by independent external experts – 3 experts assess each proposal in a one-step evaluation procedure

Start with an Erasmus Mundus Design Measure and launch the basis for a joint programme



What is the rationale behind Erasmus Mundus Design Measure?

Encouraging the development of **new**, **innovative**, **high level integrated transnational study programmes at Master level**

Diversifying the offer of JM programmes and involve EM under represented EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme, and/or institutions from these countries, and/or thematic areas



What is an EMDM?

EMDM

Short duration grant to support institutions in the set-up of a new joint master programme in Europe (and beyond)

One beneficiary mobilising a group of other HEIs

Independent funding scheme from EMJM (independent calls for proposals)



Expected outcomes of an EMDM (1)



The jointly designed master should:

- ✓ Offer a fully integrated curriculum delivered by a consortium (involving at least three HEIs from three different countries, of which at least two must be EU Member States or third countries associated to the Programme)
- ✓ Aim at attracting excellent students worldwide
- ✓ Include **physical mobility** for all recruited students
- ✓ Lead to either a **Joint degree** or **multiple degrees**



Expected outcomes of an EMDM (2)




Joint mechanisms to be included in the design of the master programme:

- ✓ Joint programme design and joint procedures
- ✓ Joint administrative and financial management
- Common services offered to students
- ✓ Joint promotion and dissemination
- ✓ A draft joint Partnership and Student Agreement
- ✓ A joint degree policy and launch of accreditation process
- + explore opportunities offered by the European Approach for Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes (if national legislation allows)



Taking part as an Organisation




Applications can be submitted by any HEI in an EU Member State, third country associated to the Programme or third country not associated to the Programme

For HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: valid ECHE

For HEIs in third countries not associated to the programme: ECHE not required but should adhere to its principles







EMDM Award Criteria and Evaluation Procedure

Evaluation procedure

Peer review by independent external experts – **2 experts** assess each proposal in a one-step evaluation procedure

EMDM Award criteria

- Relevance of the project (max 40 points)
- Quality of the project design and implementation (max 20 points)
- Quality of the partnership and cooperation arrangements (max 20 points)
- Impact (max 20 points)

Application package – EMJM

The application form is structured in 3 parts

Part A - Administrative Forms

Contains general information about the project, data on the applicant organisation and contact persons

• **Part B** – Technical description & annexes

Contains the narrative part of the project, the work packages, milestones & deliverables.

Part C – Administrative forms

Specificities about the EMJM (numbers of ECTS, accreditation, type of degrees to be awarded, etc)

- Complete Part A & C directly on the Portal
- Prepare Part B in advance and upload it together with the mandatory annexes (and the optional ones if applicable)



Application package - EMDM

The application form is structured in 3 sections:

Part A – Administrative forms

General information about the project, data on the applicant organisation and contact persons, legal declarations, etc

Part B – Technical description & annexes

Contains the narrative part of the project, the work package and the deliverables

Part C – Administrative forms

Specificities about the EMDM (nr. of ECTS, type of degrees to be awarded, etc)



Pay particular attention to the instructions given on the Portal under **Topic conditions and documents**, in particular section **6. Application form templates, guidance and model grant agreement (MGA)**



Complete Part A & C directly on the

- ✓ Opening of the Call: November 2021 (tbc)
- ✓ Deadline: February 2022
- ✓ Expected date of selection results: Summer 2022
- ✓ Budget: tbc
- ✓ Nr. of projects for EMJM: ~ 27 (tbc)
- ✓ Nr. of projects for EMDM: ~ 55 (tbc)
