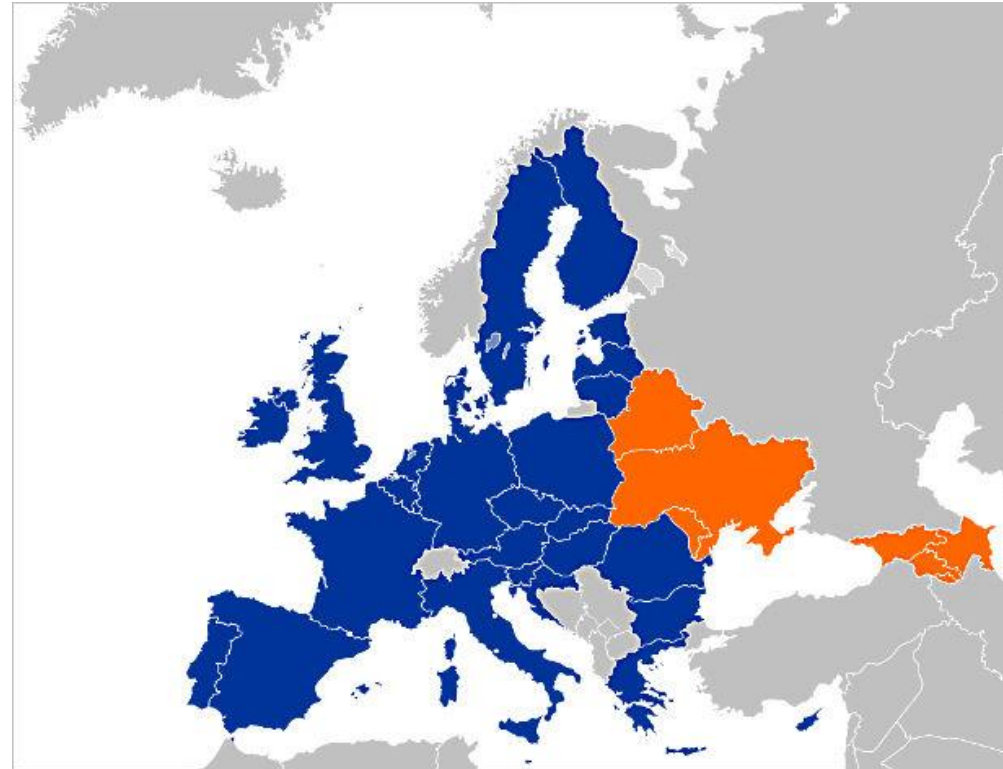

Georgian – Austrian Cooperation “before” Erasmus+



- Tempus (1995 – 2013)
 - 9 projects (out of 77; 11.7%) in the field of education, agriculture, tourism, engineering, QA, LLL)
- Erasmus Mundus Action 2
 - 2 partnerships (out of 23 consortia), both with University of Graz
- Jean Monnet
 - 1 networking project with University of Graz “European Law in the Southern Caucasus”

Georgian – Austrian Cooperation “after” Erasmus+



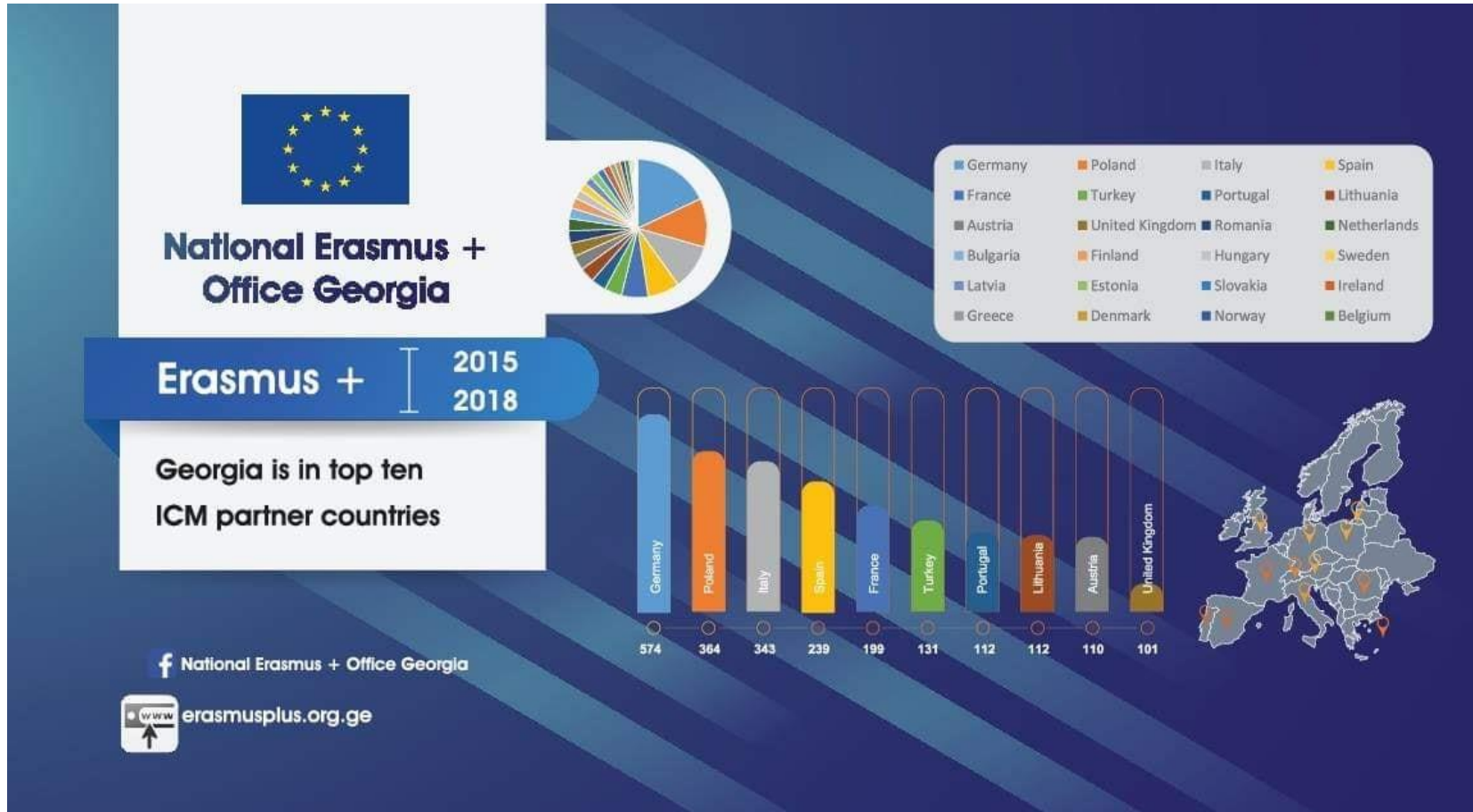
- CBHE projects
 - 9 projects (out of 24, 37.5%) in the field of education, social sciences, student services, university governance, etc.
- ICM projects
 - 9 Georgian HEIs cooperate with 7 Austrian HEIs

Lessons learned

- Personal contacts mean a lot!!!
- What do we offer? Georgian HEIs need to revise and revisit, but number of study programmes and courses in foreign languages is growing
 - Up to 1000 courses/modules in foreign languages (89% in English, rest in German & French & Russian)
 - 14 Georgian HEIs provide 97 degree programmes (B, M, D) in English
- Triplication of incoming students and staff is important

General Rules



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- Call open once a year (October with deadlines in February – March)
 - **N.B. October 2019 – last call under this Erasmus+ cycle!**
 - Eligibility criteria!
 - IRO is main contact point for partner search

 - Important: **inclusion**

 - National Erasmus+ Office provides information, advise, participates in selection and monitoring of projects

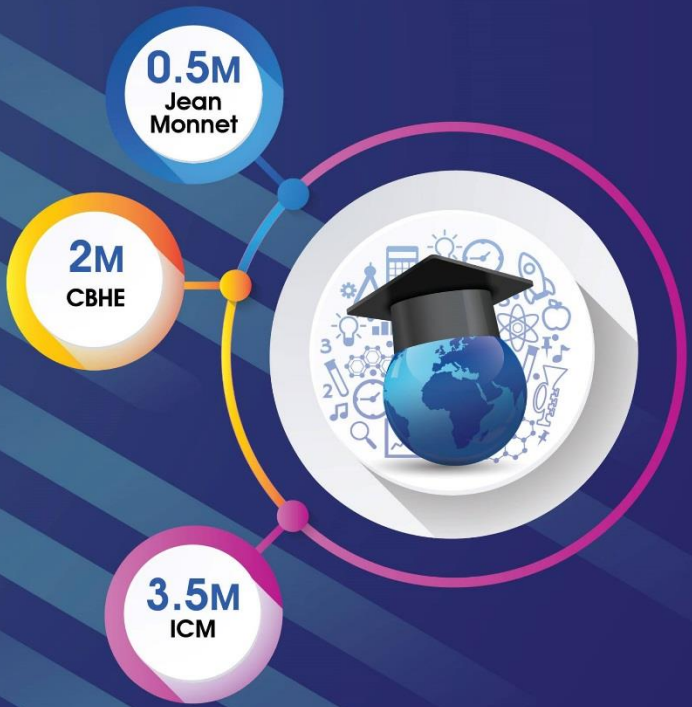
