To foster the employability and entrepreneurial readiness of VET students, preparing and connecting them to the labour market.




To adapt technical, pedagogical and didactical skills of VET teachers to the upcoming environmental, social and economic challenges.

Career guidance in Greenovet

- Greenovet aims to build a 'skills ecosystem' in each of the four CoVE regions that
 ensures learners gain high quality vocational skills and competences that are
 closely linked and co-developed with industry/business and regional needs.
- Delivered through building a wide coalition of stakeholders that develop and implement the regional strategy – reflected in management structure for each regional CoVE that brings together educational instituions, VET providers and industry.
- In each region, specific products and services will be developed.
- In Styria, a lifelong learning approach is planned that is based on modularised and 'agile' programme, with digital and online learning components. Educational programmes (ECTS levels 4-8) delivered through educational partners (higher education, VET, secondary school), supported by career guidance services within institutions.
- Private sector is also engaged to utilise the products and services for further development of skills of their employees and workers.
