Short description of mobility and / or project idea(s) with Ukraine (200 - 500 words)			
<p>Ukrainian dental students can take part in practical and theoretical courses at Danube Private University during short-term stays. These are stays with a maximum duration of 7 days, whereby special interest courses can be organized for the students (either in German, English or Russian). The Danube Private University has previously organised a series of extracurricular courses for students and young dentists from Ukraine, training them in the field of digital dentistry and periodontology. Due to the relatively high costs of the course materials, these courses are not completely free of charge, but the fee is a small amount.</p> <p>Faculty members of Ukrainian universities have the opportunity to participate in practical pre-clinical courses at Danube Private University as tutors for local students over a longer period of time (several weeks or months). While their stay, the Ukrainian colleagues will assist a course instructor in enhancing students' practical abilities by actively assisting students in the internalisation of the practical steps of dental treatment, which are simulated on a phantom head. The colleagues will assist in the supervision of live demonstrations and will also demonstrate the practical steps in a one-to-one setting. The language of instruction is German, although English is understood by all students and course tutors. In addition, there is the possibility of a research stay if a scientific cooperation with a Ukrainian university is established.</p>

<p>We have several ideas for cooperation with researchers from Ukrainian universities. We also see an opportunity to develop joint (or national) Unique Selling Points that will help position our partners (as well as our university) on the international arena. For instance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are interested in joint research projects related to management in for- and non-profit sectors. Especially, we would like to learn more about strategies to cope with turbulent environments, about mental health (e.g. burnout) of employees and managers, as well as digital innovation under condition of high uncertainty. We are eager and willing to conduct joint studies with Ukrainian researchers and advance science with knowledge about firms, health care institutions, or other organisations which have to act in the conditions of running warfare. We are also interested in knowledge and experience of working with cyber threats and digital warfare. As Ukraine became a battle arena for cyber adversaries, the country has shown advancement and can help other European countries face this challenge. We see potential in data collection and processing to produce high-quality academic publications. Ukraine has a unique potential for investigation of turbulent environments. This allows for advancements in dynamic capabilities research as well as research on systematic (enterprise) risk management. As a tourism region, the federal state of Tyrol and the MCI in particular are interested in cooperation in this domain. Although we see the limitation in the tourist capacity due to the war, we may have an experience exchange for after-war tourism development in Ukraine.

As a truly cross-border university, SFU welcomes student mobility from the UA and is also interested in participating in various staff mobility programmes.</p> <p>Our recently submitted project in Horizon EU will look at how reactionary, identitarian and extremist (RIE) movements and politics have emerged in Europe in recent years, with an alarming increase in the radicalisation of young men. Many of these ideals and politics develop in online forums and platforms - often seen as tools of radicalisation - and are then passed on in everyday social circles and disseminated by political channels used as a very effective propaganda weapon in Russia's war against Ukraine. In an effort to understand and counter these trends, UNMASC aims to examine the specific construction and representation of masculinity in RIE movements in order to provide a comprehensive interpretation of the recent rise of RIE politics and radicalisation based on a multidisciplinary, trauma-informed approach.</p>

This strand of cooperation, being pursued by the Department for Legal Studies and International Relations under Prof. DDr. Thomas Ratka, LL.M., will bear particular significance in light of the European Council's decision in December 2023 to open accession negotiations with Ukraine.</p> <p>Given that Ukraine, like all EU candidate counties, needs to massively build up competences in EU law and thus the conditions for accession in the public sector, the initiative has therefore set itself the task of training civil servants from Ukraine (and potentially other candidate countries):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in the most important acquis-relevant topics in order to prepare them and their home countries; prepare them and their home countries for accession negotiations in the best possible way with a lasting effect. <p>In order to equip Ukrainian civil servants with profound knowledge in these two fields, the planned programme will provide practice-oriented training in European Integration covering issues such as European Institutional Law, Single Market Law, the political economy and policy questions. Moreover, the respective need for reform in the individual 35 negotiation chapters of the acquis will also be identified and documented for the participants as part of specialised training courses, thus laying the foundation for both substantive negotiations and the implementation of necessary reforms.</p> <p>The TSNUK Educational and Scientific Institute of Public Administration and Civil Service has been identified as strategic partner of the UWK in this endeavour. The primary focus of this effort is on prosthetics development and prosthetic care, enabling young people to sustainably address both the infrastructural problems and the shortage of qualified professionals in Ukraine.</p> <p>To meet the quality standards in education, I can regularly send used prostheses to Ukraine from AUVA (the first delivery of prostheses took place in December 2023). I am willing to engage in practical work on specific topics (bachelor's theses, master's theses, doctoral theses) due to current circumstances and share the results.</p> <p>At the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria (FH OÖ), I hold a fixed teaching and research position as part of a 50% part-time employment as follows: Monday (08:00 - 17:00), Tuesday (08:00 - 17:00), Thursday (08:00 - 12:00). Within this 50% part-time role, a project duration of up to 5 years is possible for me. However, a project duration of three years seems reasonable, since a bachelor's degree program also has this duration. The project could be carried out in a block format, requiring approximately three two-day blocks per semester.
