The Austrian Education System



The Austrian Education System

Compulsory schooling for 9 years

Public schools are financed by the government

- Free of charge for pupils

Higher Education Sector

- 23 public universities – approx. **77 % of students**
- 21 universities of applied sciences/UAS [*Fachhochschulen*] – approx. **15 % of students**
- 14 university colleges of teacher education [*Pädagogische Hochschulen*] – approx. **6 % of students**
- 19 private universities – approx. **2 % of students**
- The language of instruction is generally **German**, there are an increasing number of full degree programmes in **English**

Public Universities

Public Higher Education Institutions

Long tradition of Higher Education

The first university in Austria was founded in **1365** (University of Vienna)

Universities

- Comprehensive institutions with a wide variety of disciplines
- Specialised universities for arts and music, medicine, technical and business studies, mining, agricultural sciences
- Free access to most university degree programmes (though some have limited access or entrance exams)
- Academic degrees that are awarded: Bachelor, Master, PhD
some 'old' degree programmes (diploma and doctoral studies) exist

Higher Education in Austria

Universities of Applied Sciences (Fachhochschulen)

Universities of Applied Sciences

- profession-oriented higher education programmes
- many curricula include mandatory *practical training or internships*
- limited number of places → entrance procedures in place
- *part-time programmes* designed for working students
- academic degrees: Bachelor & Master → graduates of UAS Master's programmes may enrol in doctoral programmes e.g. at public universities
- comparably high number of *English* language courses offered

Higher Education in Austria

Private Universities

- Fully and officially accredited private institutions with a variety of fields of study

Teacher Training in Austria

For primary school teachers:

- At university colleges of teacher education

For secondary school teachers – schools of general education and schools of vocational education:

- At university colleges of teacher education and at universities

New:

- One-year induction phase (in-service introduction)

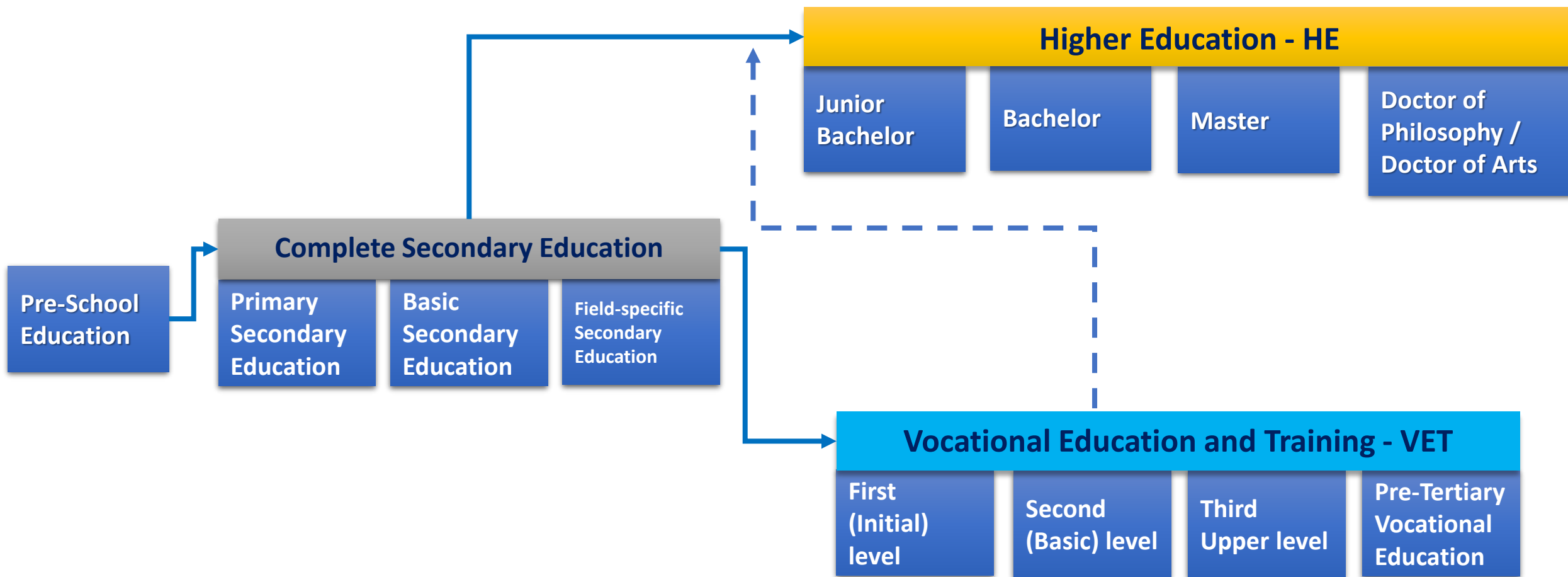

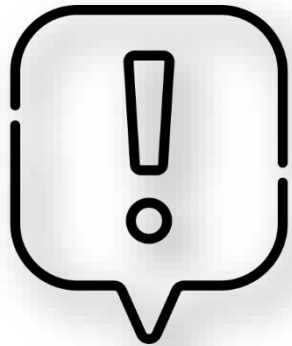
Recognition of Academic (Credit) Mobility and Qualifications



Recognition of higher education qualifications within the Higher Education system is carried out in accordance with the Law on Higher Education - by the decision of the Academic Council of the HEI.

Within Erasmus+ projects, Inter-Institutional Agreement is a MUST to organise official mobility and recognition of learning outcomes and mobility periods.

Recommendation: to have internal mobility regulations to avoid internal risks regarding the recognition of learning outcomes.

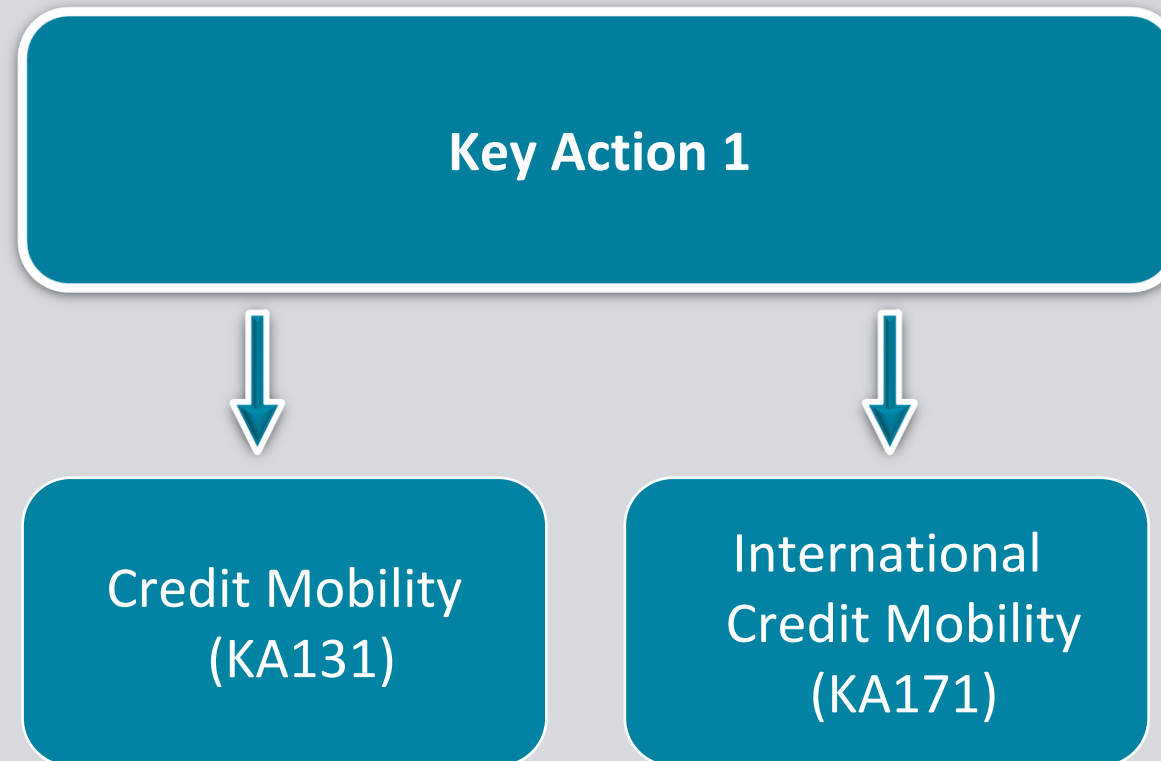

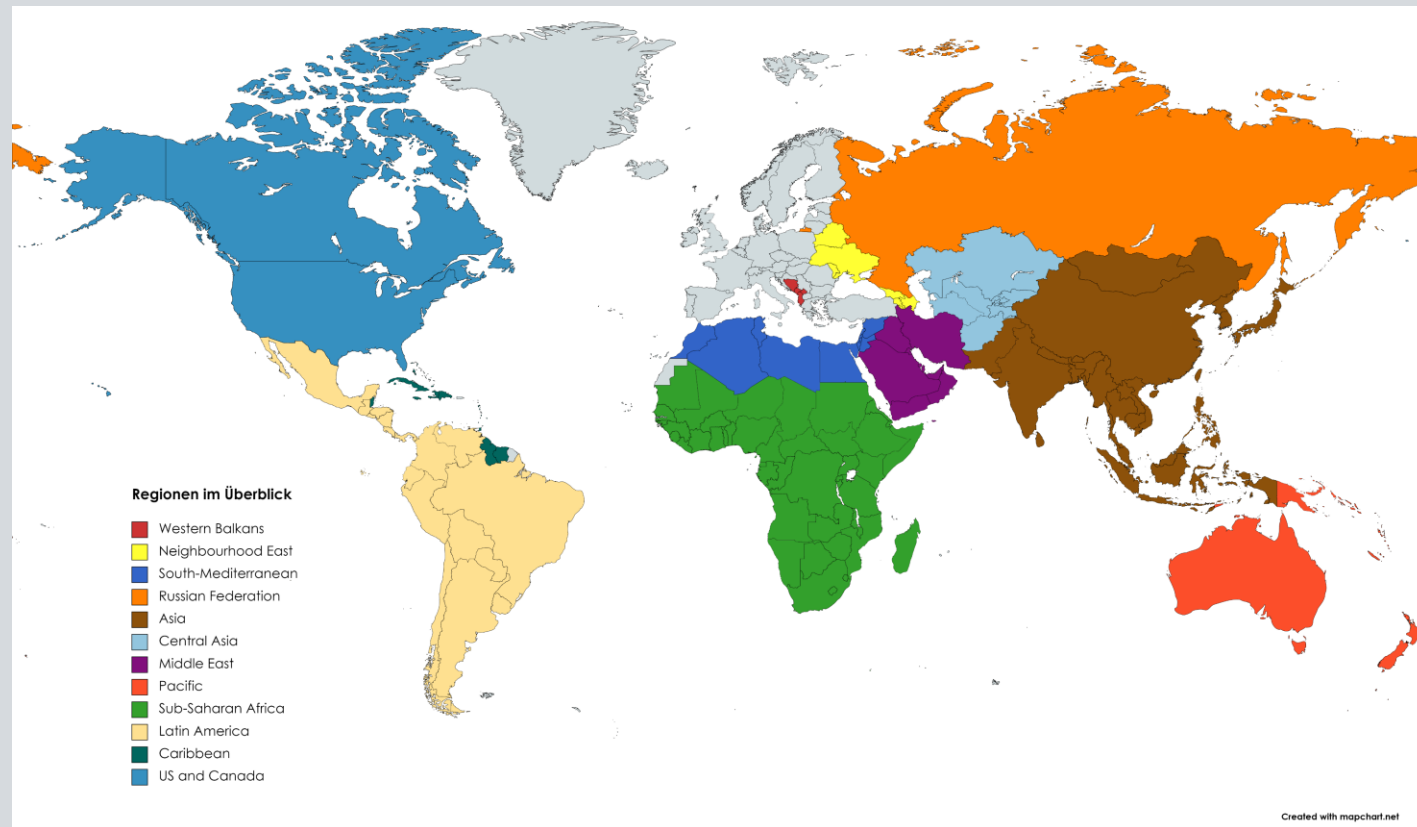

Key Action 1: Mobility Projects for Higher Education Students and Staff



Scope of Mobility Projects for Higher Education Students and Staff



Opportunities: Activity types for students I

- Long-term student mobility for studies (SMS)
 - Duration: 2-12 months
- Long-term student mobility for traineeships (SMT)
 - Duration: 2-12 months
 - Traineeship for recent graduates
- Short-term mobilities with a compulsory virtual component (5-30 days)
- Blended mobility: virtual components in SMS and SMT

→ Only virtual mobility (without physical mobility) is not possible!

Opportunities: Activity types for students II

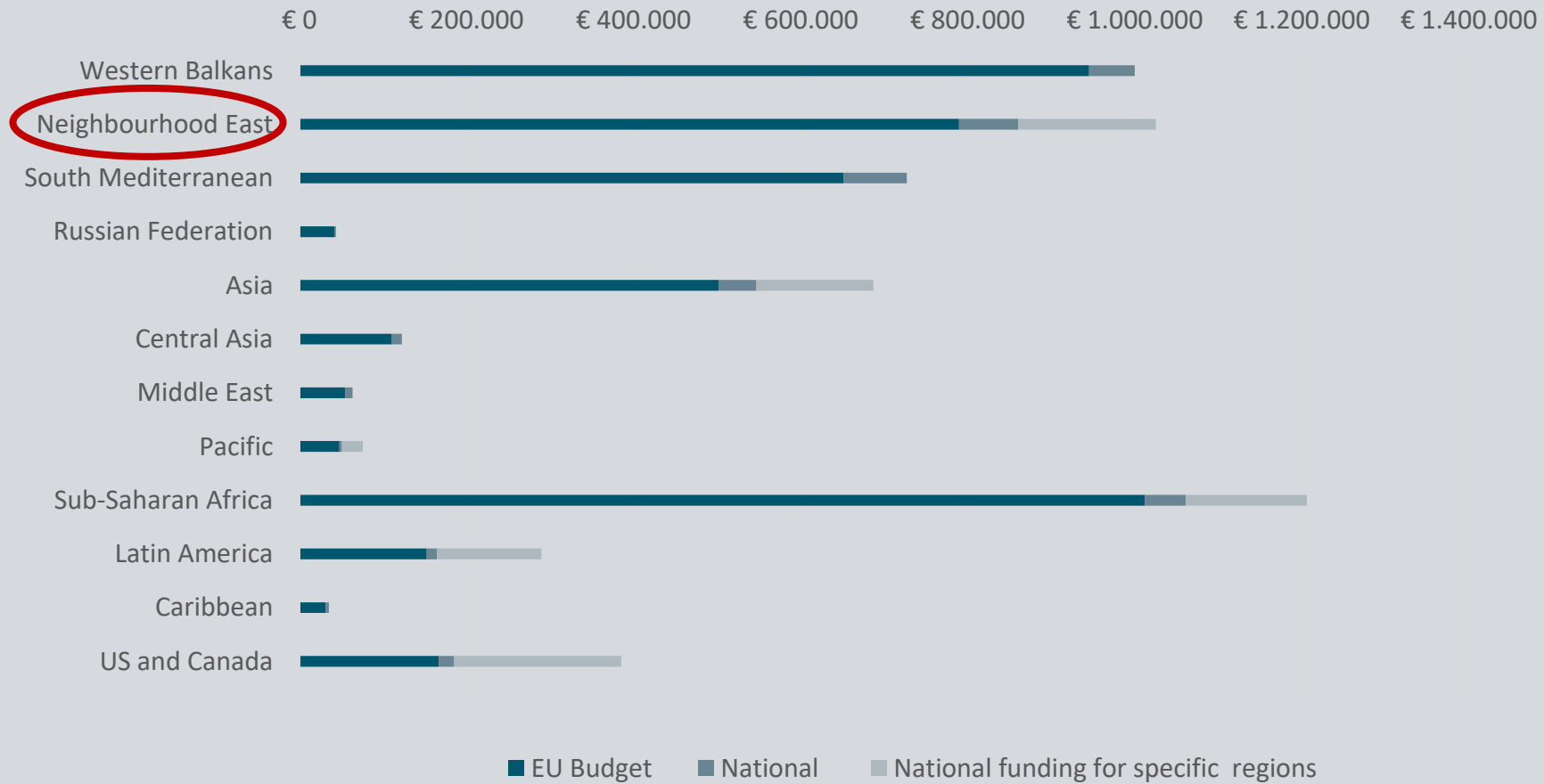
- Financial support

- **Travel grant** calculation based on the distance between sending and receiving institution (“**distance band**”) (Call 2024: 309 Euro/417 Euro green travel)
- **Incoming** students to Austria: 900 Euro/month +250 Euro top-up/month
- **Outgoing students from Austria**: 700 Euro per month
Credit mobility (KA131): outgoing mobility (AUT→ UA) on all levels possible
ICM (KA171): restriction on outgoing mobilities on BA/MA level
→ no restriction on PhD level or incoming mobility flows

Opportunities: Activity types for HE staff

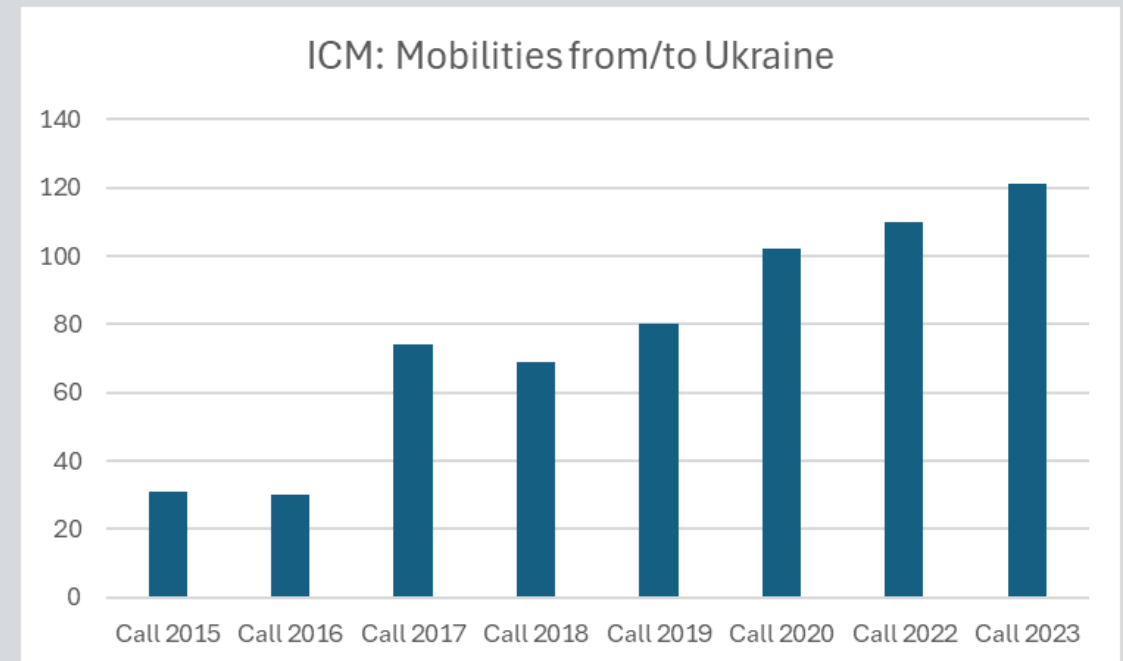
- Staff mobility for teaching/training (STA)/(STT)
 - Duration: 5 – 60 days
 - Teaching at partner universities
 - Staff training such as professional courses, staff training week, job shadowing etc.
- Financial support
 - Outgoing staff from Austria: 190 Euro per day → no restrictions (!)
 - Incoming staff to Austria: 190 Euro per day
 - Travel grant calculation based on the distance between sending and receiving institution („distance band“) (Call 2024: 309 Euro/417 Euro green travel)

Figures on cooperation between Austria and Ukraine

- **Credit mobility (KA131):** 10 HEIs with Ukraine amendment (Call 2022), 32 mobilities realised
- **ICM (KA171)**
 - 65 ongoing partnerships (IIA)
 - continuous increase of mobilitites



Application process

- Annual call – next deadline probably **February 2025**
- Only **programme country** HEIs (= Austrian) can **apply**
- Application in Credit Mobility (KA131): application based on planned mobilities and Ukraine amendment
- Application in ICM (KA171): planned mobilities and qualitative/narrative **parts** on project design, relevance and indicative impact and dissemination strategies
- **Cooperation** with **more than one HEI** within one region is **possible**

Application: Things to keep in mind

- Take your time to prepare the application
- Get to know your partner and the procedures in place thoroughly (especially for new partners)
- Make use of existing networks and build upon established partnerships
- Combine complementary funding schemes
- Start with staff mobility when targeting a new partner
- Important: application (ICM) must contain perspectives and positions of both institutions in equal measure!!

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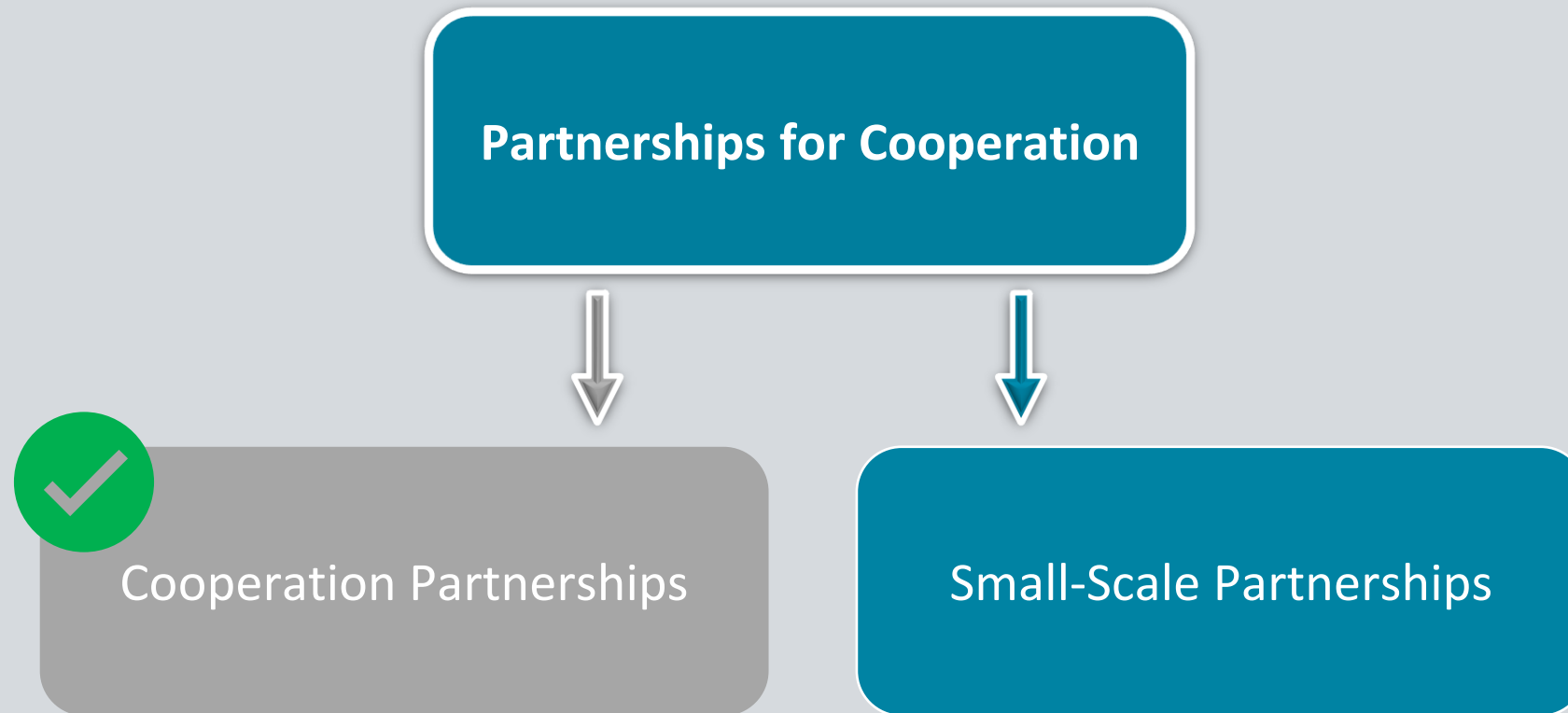



Purpose

- **Project types:**
 - **National projects** involving HEIs from only one third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme
 - **Multi-country (regional) projects** involving HEIs from more than one third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme but within one region
 - **Multi-country cross-regional** involving HEIs from more than one region (cross-regional)
- **Minimum requirements for a consortium:**
 - 1 HEI from 2 different countries from: EU27, IS, LT, MK, NO, RS or TR
 - At least 2 HEI from each participating third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme in the project → **Some additional rules!**

The project aims to foster students’ employability by developing their relevant professional competencies and civic engagement through the comprehensive tutoring and mentoring (T&M) system at partner HEIs as a response to the labour market demands. The university T&M system will function on the base of an integrated set of methods, algorithms, and procedures enriched with the dedicated IT-platform, university organizational structures, trained staff, and active senior students. In complex, it will become an element of the sustainable educational process, that will develop and improve students’ hard and soft skills, as well as active engagement in civic life.

The project activities are focused on developing basic tutoring and mentoring schemes, installing T&M centers, developing teaching/learning materials and tools, training academic staff, students and mentors from industry, as well as cooperating between targeted HEIs through the internationalization of partners’ expertise, and strengthen their relations with the wider socio-economic environment.

The general objective of the PeaceEdu project is to foster sustainable practices of Peace in Ukraine, Georgia, and Moldova through strengthening the capacity and capability of higher educational institutions in these countries to invest in the development of multi-disciplinary peace education and peace studies. This will be achieved not only by supporting the relevant curriculum design and delivery of pilot courses but also by generating cross-regional network of learning as well as enhancing dialogue with best practices from other European countries. Through enhancing capacity of the beneficiary HEIs, the project addresses peace and security challenges in the EaP Countries (UA, GE, MD).

The focus of this project is to develop tools to mitigate challenges that put Peace under threat in the respective communities.

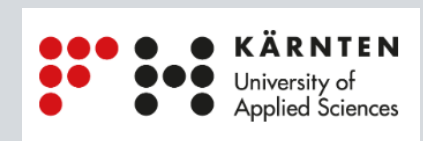

The goal of the proposed project is to narrow the existing gap between the rapid pace of digital transformation, and the training of specialists from different fields, especially those that are not related to IT. At present the specialists are not sufficiently skilled to efficiently work with digital technologies and tools, and to understand possible pitfalls in their use, including mental health issues and legal matters.

Among the objectives of the NEXT project are the following:
1) introducing informal extracurricular education on digital skills, soft skills, mental health, and digitalization's legal aspects to students; 2) training academic staff of HEIs in order to support learners with qualified coaches who can assist them in their informal studies; 3) developing innovative learning resources in line with the newest trends in digital technologies; 4) enhancing students' teamwork and digital skills through student projects contest; 5) establishing advanced laboratories in Ukrainian universities for Metaverse-like communications.

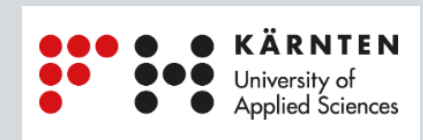

The Internationalization and sustainability are growing missions of Higher Education institutions (HEIs) worldwide aimed to promote a high quality and interconnected academic system responding to the emerging global challenges and the training needs of the new students’ generation. The SIN-NEC project addresses the need to enhance sustainability and internationalization competences of less-experienced, newcomers AM and UA HEIs with the support of 3 EU partners and 1 experienced AM HEI.

To fulfil this goal, the project, after a comprehensive self-assessment, will build capacities of academics, managers and administrative staff on planning and development of strategies and action plans towards internationalization and sustainability. The project will upskill teachers on teaching and training on innovative pedagogics and digital tools in virtual environments to enhance their internationalization potential. Training will be addressed to sustainability and sustainable entrepreneurship that will be used to develop and pilot new modules.

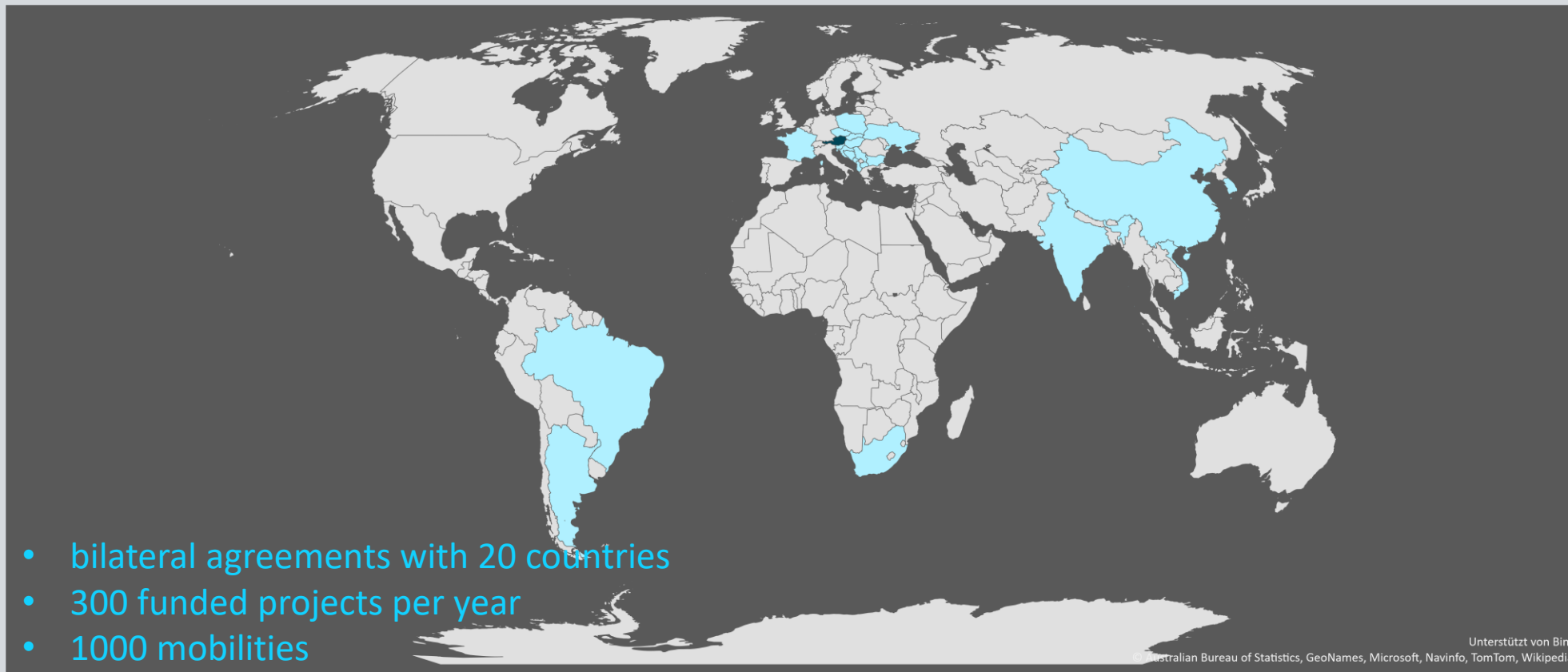

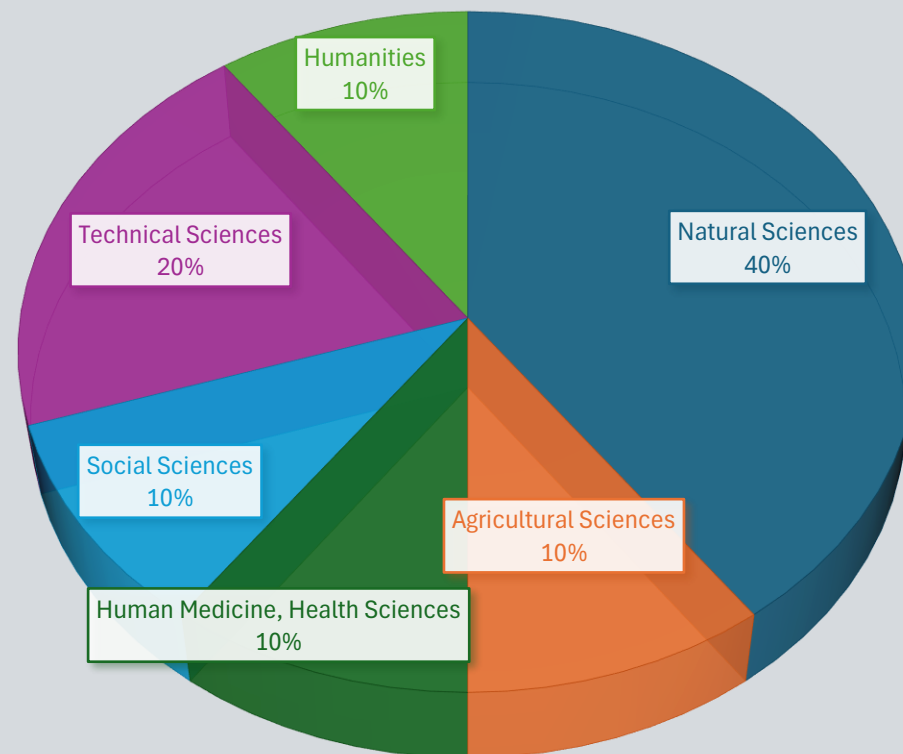
